A PRIMORDIAL POWER EMERGES



In the dark crypt of being, a primordial power older than time and vaster than the stars undulates and swirls, urging all life ever onward in its harmonious, perfect cycles and seasons, underpinning all existence. A bequest and creation of the Goddess, this power operates at her behest, serving as emissary, teacher, healer, and wayshower to humankind.

This potent power is an enduring, ancient archetype, accessible in the boundless unconscious by those who dare to delve into occult regions existing beyond space, time, and the confines of the third dimension.

Others have met this power in her aspect as keeper of nature in the shadow of the wood, where trees whisper their sweet secrets; in the falling autumn leaf, the glistening silver of the moon, the whip of the wind, the streams of waters, both salty and sweet, and the dancing firelight casting shadows upon the faces that behold it.

This potent power and primordial force—the ancient archetype, emissary of the Goddess, keeper of nature, wisdom teacher, healer, and wayshower—is the witch.

The witch is a wielder of power. Raw. Unmitigated. Undifferentiated.

Though she is hidden, the witch whispers a secret call to her would-be initiates from the cauldron of the heart. Accessible by all, yet answered by few, the call bids us to enter a shadowy world to explore and understand the multi-faceted, enigmatic, wildly popular powerhouse that is witch.

The witch has been with us for thousands of years, and she'll be with us for thousands more. She is both magickal and mystical, sparking the imagination and lore of humans for eons. Some consider her a helper to humanity while others see her as a foe. How admirers or detractors choose to consider the witch has no effect on the enduring pinnacle of magick she is or the power she wields, or the influence she has on consciousness and the activities of humans in every sphere of endeavor.

The witch touches us all.

When one answers the call of the witch from deep within, worlds open and new energies reveal themselves, though they were present all along as undetected potentialities. One finds their connection with the witch to be an empowering adjunct to all human actions, causing outcomes beyond what can be expected by simply performing tasks. If one fully succumbs to the witch within, each human action becomes infused with magick, wonder, and potency, often creating non-ordinary and supernatural results. The witch exploits synchronicity for its dynamic organizing and timing power. What we once thought impossible becomes doable and natural; that which we once viewed as occult, hidden, secret, and the unknowable reveals itself in full array over time, with stunning accuracy, as one dares to venture deeper.

Witch is a way of being, existing in the core of the spirit, heart, mind, bones, and blood of those who have chosen to welcome her in, and who own and embody this incomprehensible power.

When courage prompts us to say *yes* to the inner witch, a knowing arises. One who knows herself as a witch is aware of the unmitigated power residing within, along with the right and responsibility to use it. A witch knows that all is connected through a great web of life. Anything that affects one aspect

of the web affects the whole. This power is to be wielded only after training and achieving proficiency.

Because the witch is an emissary of the Goddess, she stirs, awakens, and activates latent gifts, energies, and potentialities in those who come under her tutelage. The gifts are used according to intention and will. She can peer into the future, parallel universes, and worlds unknown to those who are not able to access this important information. The witch also can serve humanity in a plethora of ways, to include employing magick and witchcraft to create, transform, and eliminate.

GIFTS OF THE WITCH

What are the gifts of the witch? They include the “clears:”

- Clairvoyance (clear seeing)
- Clairaudience (clear hearing)
- Claircognizance (clear knowing)
- Clairsentience (clear feeling)

Other gifts that the Divine has bestowed upon witches include the precognition of information, which appears as images in the third eye or in the dream state. Witches can access the ability to *divine*, to know the mind of God with the aid of tools such as Tarot cards; rune symbols carved with intention on stones, which were originally used by Germanic peoples; tea leaves; bones; cowrie shells, used by West African peoples to access the wisdom of the ancestors, spirits, and gods or Orisha; dowsing rods; crystal balls; the planets and stars; and pendulums.

Mediumship—the ability to commune with spirits who have left the third dimension and abide in dimensions beyond—is a domain of the witch. A famed example of a witch skilled in mediumship is the Witch of Endor from the Holy Bible, who was able to conjure the spirit of Samuel and view

him clearly, complete with the clothing he'd worn in his human life. She ascertained all information from the dead prophet accurately, including predictions that were fulfilled in short order.

Witches commune and experience companionship with nature and nature spirits. We use this powerful gift to understand the workings of the universe, inform our spellwork, and make our rituals both potent and memorable. A deep, visceral understanding and desire to connect and commune with nature in all its forms—the essence of trees, plants, herbs, flowers, roots, fruits, vegetables, wind, storms, streams, rivers, oceans, stones, mountains, caves, animals, birds, and insects—factors into the life, walk, and workings of the witch and her craft. The witch understands a simple truth: What you love will tell you its secrets. A witch loves nature, and therefore, the secrets of nature are revealed to her.

In my walk as a witch, I hold two truths dear:

First, *all is Divine*. Reverence for all life, in its manifold and splendid forms, is a code for me and for many other witches. Countless witches adhere, as best we can, to the edict to “harm none.” As is taught in the mystery school I founded, “harm none” goes far beyond not swatting at a fly or stomping on an insect. We seek to subscribe to the principle of *ahimsa*, a Sanskrit word that means to not inflict injury but also has a deeper occult meaning.

“Ahimsa means not to injure any creature by thought, word, or deed,” taught Gandhi. The principle of harmlessness is the same for witches. Those who adhere to the principle of harmlessness have chosen to treat all life as sacred and as an expression of the Divine. Our reverence for life elicits awe. To walk upon the earth as a beneficial presence—and not simply as someone who does no harm—is to practice *ahimsa*. Some witches undertake a vow of harmlessness; I took my vow many years ago in a sacred initiation, in which I swore an oath to the All that I would not only refrain from intentionally causing harm, but I would intend and actively become a universal force for good.

The second truth I hold dear as a witch is that my mind, will, words, and actions form the ultimate magick wand. I can employ these things to effect change in the physical universe and in any sphere of life experience.

Though she utilizes a plethora of accoutrement, a witch knows *she* is the power, even without a wand, crystals, incense, or any other tool. The power resides in and of the witch and can be accessed and channeled to heal, transform, correct, and/or eliminate crossed conditions. The witch can direct, with intention and will, the potent and palpable energies at her disposal. We will discuss many of those energies here.

Welcome to the world of the witch and the mysteries inherent in this ancient archetype. We shall explore both with an intention to shed light in the darkness, so we emerge with wisdom regarding this primordial force.

THE HEDGE WITCH AND THE SHAMAN

The shaman called. He was troubled because his favorite, youngest son, the heir to his clan, was ill. The young boy was not responding to any of the medicines of his father, a long-trained elder who walked with strong energies.

The voice of Iron Walks with Two Fists was trembling, and he was as close to pleading as a man of his stature would allow when speaking to a woman.

“Come... do what you can. This is urgent. You say you have ability. This is a test I pray you pass.”

I gathered my pouches and drove to the compound, where I found a dark pall. The clan members were sitting in a circle, silent, shaking rattles. The shaman gestured to the door, opened it, and said, “Do your work.” Then he left.

The young boy was lying still, barely breathing. I wondered why his father didn’t take him to the hospital, but I understood he held little faith in modern ways of healing.

The pressure to perform was enormous. I had to collect myself to shift from fear into my empty, clear-hearted healer's mind to assess the energy before me.

I set out my pouches, lit a candle, took a few deep breaths, and began. I lifted the boy's cold, pale leg and began "reading" some of the seventy-two pulses I am trained to interpret, to find out what was moving in his blood.

Having the information I needed, I began working with the many "voices of unseen ones." I took out my mortar and pestle and then opened the door and asked to see the spices in the kitchen. I found what was useful in the cupboards and set a pot of water to boil.

I asked a member of the rattling group to go fetch river mud and some plants that grew near the edge of the field. I started grinding the herbal elders I had in my pouches and poured them into the boiling water, to prepare a tea. Mixing spices from the kitchen rack with the found mud and plants, I prepared a poultice.

I undressed the weak child and smeared the earthy poultice over various organs and the bottoms of his feet. Then I wrapped him up in his blanket, tight as a burrito, hoping he would soon sweat. I dropped tiny drops of the tea over his cracked, dried lips for about an hour.

I sang healing songs.

After another hour, his breathing began to deepen. He began to cough and spit out thick, grey globs of phlegm. I called for a helper to sit with him while I returned to the kitchen to cut up roots and twigs for a broth. I added some chicken bones.

When I returned with the steaming mixture, the boy was sitting upright in bed and had a bit of color in his face. I smiled at him and said, "You are here now! Sip this soup slowly while it's hot." He picked up the spoon and, while I held the bowl, he ate.

Within the hour, he began looking more alive. I took the bowl from his hands, grateful and deeply relieved.

Once more, I monitored his pulses and found them to be gaining clarity, strength, and life force. I gave thanks and sang songs to the unseen ones, to the medicine keepers, and to the lineage teachers who had trained me. They had helped me restore the boy to health and return him to his clan.

Feeling only gratitude and relief, I rolled up my sheets, put my tools away, and cleared my pouches. Then I bowed my head, and leaving the child with the clan, said my goodbyes and walked out of the compound.

HONORING THE ELEMENTS AND CELESTIAL CYCLES

Exploring the realm of the witch through action and expression affords deeper insight into this archetype who defies definition. A powerful witch is in alignment with the elements, energies, and cycles of nature.

A witch is an empowered being who does not seek or ask for approval or permission. She is an initiator of her entire life experience and might even be in the business of helping others do likewise. An inherent aspect of the witch is about activating, cultivating, expanding, and using power. A powerful witch acts as a force beyond comprehension and is not acted upon.

What is the source of the witch's power? This varies from witch to witch. All power is sourced from the pure field of consciousness that could be referred to as the Divine. Everything in the universe is from the same Divine source, and therefore all witches draw power from the same place—but not all witches use the same conduits of Divine energy to power their life and craft. The Divine is all. This source can be channeled in a myriad of ways and can appear in an infinite array of forms.

THE ELEMENTS

Divine energy can be channeled through and as the elements of earth, air, fire, and water. While these four elements represent the building blocks of everything in manifest reality, the fifth element, *ether*, represents the spirit realm. It is important to note that modern science agrees with the witch in its assertion that there are four states of matter: solids (earth), gas (air), plasma (fire), and liquid (water).

Examination of the elements gives us a glimpse into the operation of the witch and how these may be used to heal and transform.

EARTH

Characteristics and aspects of the element of earth include:

- Grounding
- Stabilizing
- Supporting
- Rooting

Items the witch uses to represent the element of earth include:

- Crystals
- Stones and rocks
- Precious metals
- Soil
- Ash
- Sand
- Salt

Earth is the foundation for the other three elements: air, fire, and water. Without earth, these could not exist. Earth is represented in the Tarot as the

suit of Pentacles, pertaining to the physical body, real estate, possessions, money, and everything in the material realm.

Vegetation, plants, and flowers that represent the energy of earth are root vegetables, including beets, potatoes, turnips, carrots, and bulbs that grow in the earth.

The witch calls upon the element of earth, when appropriate, to ground and root situations. This example from my life experience might help to explain the use of earth as a powerful ally.

Many years ago, after I'd left my career as a financial planner to embark on being a teacher of spirituality, I experienced a dramatic decline in income. Because I had not yet become adept at generating significant income in the realm of human transformation, I experienced countless financial setbacks, increased debt, and even losing a home. While this was all part of my personal curriculum in service of my ascension, it was painful at the time. I felt unmoored and unstable, as if a strong gust of wind could carry me anywhere it desired, whether I wanted to go or not. Something had to be done. I needed to create greater financial abundance as a steady stream of income, and I also needed a way of settling into a home and feeling grounded.

I employed earth magick for the win. I began a practice of rooting into our Earth Mother in my meditations and drawing up veritable boulders of the energy into my being. I envisioned myself as stable, planted, and in a beautiful home that was secure, financially and otherwise. It's not easy to answer the call of destiny while feeling as if one is an ever-turning leaf in the wind. This was especially challenging for me because I relate closely with the element of air and am an air sign. To change the energy and flavor of my life during that tumultuous season, I had to tap into energies beyond air. I had to root into earth.

Earth magick grounded me and my energy, affording a firmer foundation on which to build. This was primarily achieved with the help of the crystal kingdom, and particularly the harder stones in the quartz family, including:

- A tiger's eye crystal I wore as a necklace to serve as a *talisman* for grounding and centering. A talisman is an object that can be worn that carries a specific magickal intention. My intention was to ground and root myself and give my life a firm foundation.
- Pink quartz crystal, which I procured in copious amounts and placed on altars in whatever space I found myself. I also carried this crystal in my purse and pockets. The crystal rooted me in love, the most powerful force in the universe.
- Purple amethyst served me well in all my full-moon Tarot readings on why my life was unfolding as it was, what I specifically needed to change and by when, and what people and situations were problematic and which were beneficial. Purple amethyst remains one of my all-time favorite crystals for clear perception in spirit realms and was therefore twice blessed for both grounding me and affording me access to higher wisdom.
- At the top of my list of favorite crystals, because of its comprehensive healing properties, is clear quartz crystal. This is also among the hardest of stones, thus making it a perfect ally for earth magick. My clear quartz crystals were used on the altar, in readings, and on the tip of a magick wand I use to direct energy.

I'm happy to state that the magickal workings yielded extraordinary fruit in the way of increased income and a beautiful home. Of course, spiritual work alone is not sufficient to change one's life in a dramatic fashion. Taking a holistic approach to the elements means working with their physical counterparts as well as their spiritual energies. While I was doing spell work with the element of earth, I also had to write books that would provide

ongoing royalties; run a profitable business by acquiring clients; and become friendly with the energy of money. These are all earth-based pursuits. If I hadn't applied both magick and practical effort, I would not have achieved the results I desired.

AIR

Characteristics and aspects of the element of air include:

- Uplifting
- Inspiring
- Swift moving
- Clearing

Items the witch uses to represent the element of air include:

- Representations of birds and butterflies
- Feathers and wings
- Wands
- Fans
- Bells
- Incense
- Brooms and *besoms*, a broom made with natural materials such as twigs and/or branches
- Swords and *athames*, a dagger or knife used in witchcraft

The element of air is represented in the Tarot as swords and is the most problematic of all four of the suits in the book of Tarot, because it encompasses the power of negative thoughts to derail us. As a representation of the witch's mental faculties, the element of air fosters a clear mind and the ability to think critically. A witch must be able to communicate clearly in spell work and incantations, to optimize potential for changing the self and the world.

Witches who are intimately connected with and work with the element of air can call on these powers:

- A strong mental prowess that is required to understand correspondences used in spell work and to set powerful intentions, along with the mental fortitude to see them through to fruition, even when the task at hand becomes difficult and the urge to abandon the project arises. It takes a mentally strong witch to stay powerfully focused on spell work until the results are seen in the physical dimension.
- The ability to outsmart opponents as if in a game of chess, while remembering all opponents are not external. Thinking steps ahead is an unmistakable sign of the element of air.
- The ability to debate and argue a position to influence outcomes. The witch does this in physical reality as well as in dimensions of consciousness beyond this world by communicating with spirits in a compelling fashion, so that they lend their aid to the witch.

FIRE

Characteristics and aspects of the element of fire include:

- Energizing
- Vivifying
- Purifying
- Purging

Items the witch uses to represent the element of fire include:

- Fire itself, controlled indoors in a hearth or fireplace, or in an outdoor fire pit
- Candles
- Cauldrons

- Wands
- The sun

The element of fire is represented in the Tarot as the suit of wands, describing the spiritual aspect of self. Fire energizes and purges, as is illustrated in the forest, a natural domain of the witch. Even as devastating fire sweeps through the forest, we remember that all is not destroyed. Fire eats dead and decaying underbrush, leaves, and plant material, releasing nutrients into the soil that aid biodiversity while simultaneously checking species of plants that are growing out of control to the detriment of surrounding plant species.

The wisdom of fire in the wild knows when to erupt; what to clear, cleanse, and purify; and what to activate, making way for the new and unborn. Fire knows when to burn itself out.

The witch honors fire with candles for the power to catalyze healing and transformation through sacred rituals and spell work. These candles are engraved with sacred symbols and sigils, dressed with appropriate essential oils and herbs, and then burned with a powerful intention. As the candle burns, the witch “reads” the fire by paying close attention to the action and duration of the flame. After the candle has been eliminated by the element of fire, the container is also “read” by examining the pattern of wax, smoke, and remaining debris to determine the efficacy and the chances that the candle worked.

Candle meditations on the sacred flame sharpen the mind, purify thoughts, and activate and engage the third eye for active vision beyond this world.

Each year in the autumn, many witches use the element of fire at the celebration of Samhain (sow-in), a sacred festival that falls on October 31. Originating as a Celtic celebration, Samhain is now observed by Wiccans, witches, and pagans in many traditions all over the world.

I attended an open Samhain festival each year for several years conducted by a Druid and three witches. In attendance were witches of divergent backgrounds and practices, all clad in full ceremonial regalia including crowns, cloaks, and wands. It was a most sacred ceremony, and fire played the central role. We burned away old hurts, disturbing memories, and haunts from the past year by writing these on paper and releasing them into the sacred flames. We allowed every vestige of negating energy that no longer served us to be consumed at the foot of the sacred, raging fire.

WATER

Characteristics and aspects of the element of water include:

- Flowing
- Cleansing
- Refreshing
- Satiating
- Nurturing

Items the witch uses to represent the element of water include:

- Water from a variety of sources for their energetic correspondences: rain, ocean, river, lake, pond, storm. While in Egypt, I sourced water for magickal purposes from the River Nile for its storied past, and the fact that it's one of the longest rivers in the world, supporting life for millions of people in several countries along its banks in Africa. This river water can be used for its ancient and modern properties of life sustenance.
- Ocean and sea items, including shells and fins
- Chalices and cups
- Symbols of the moon
